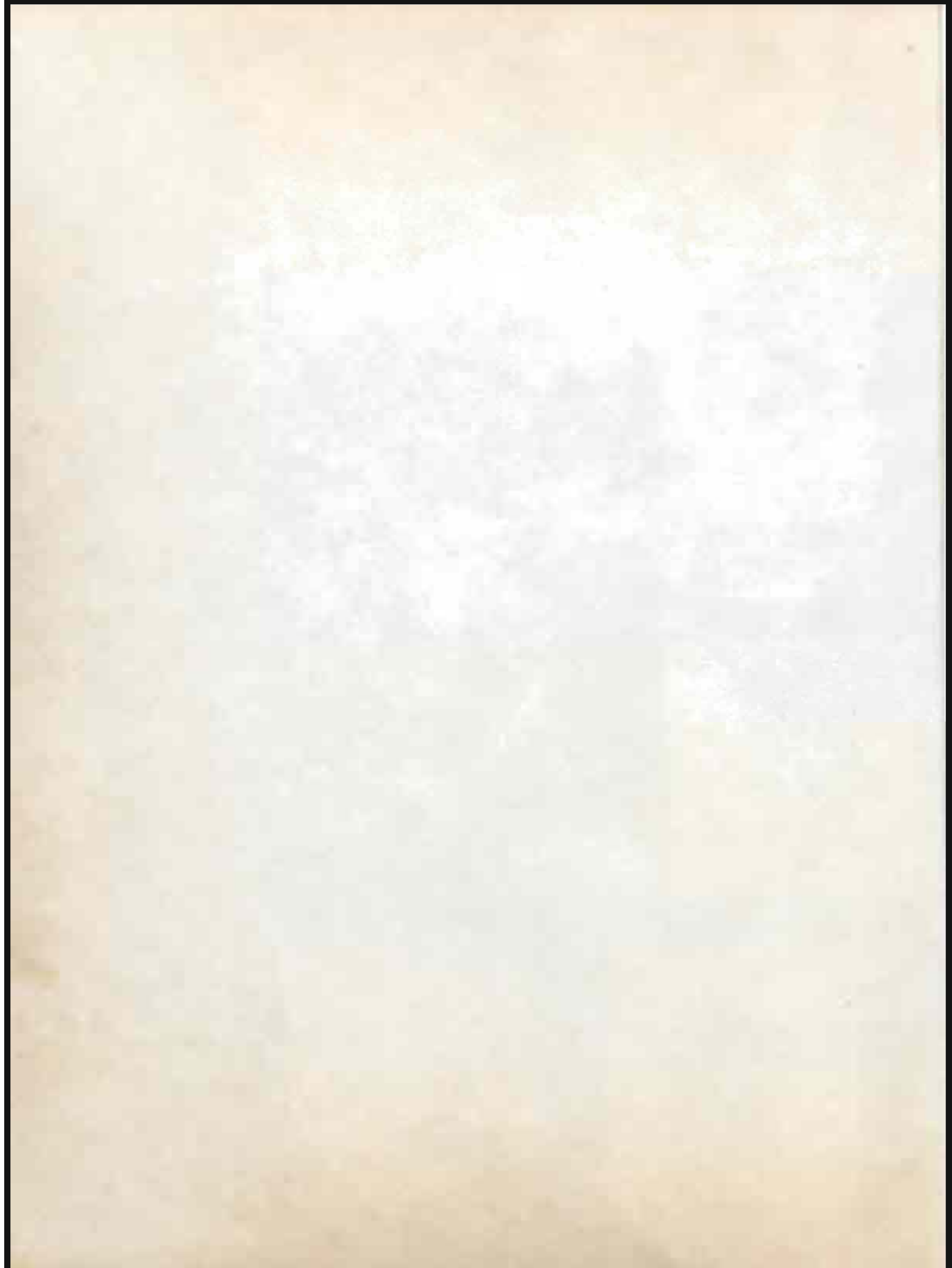

Foreword



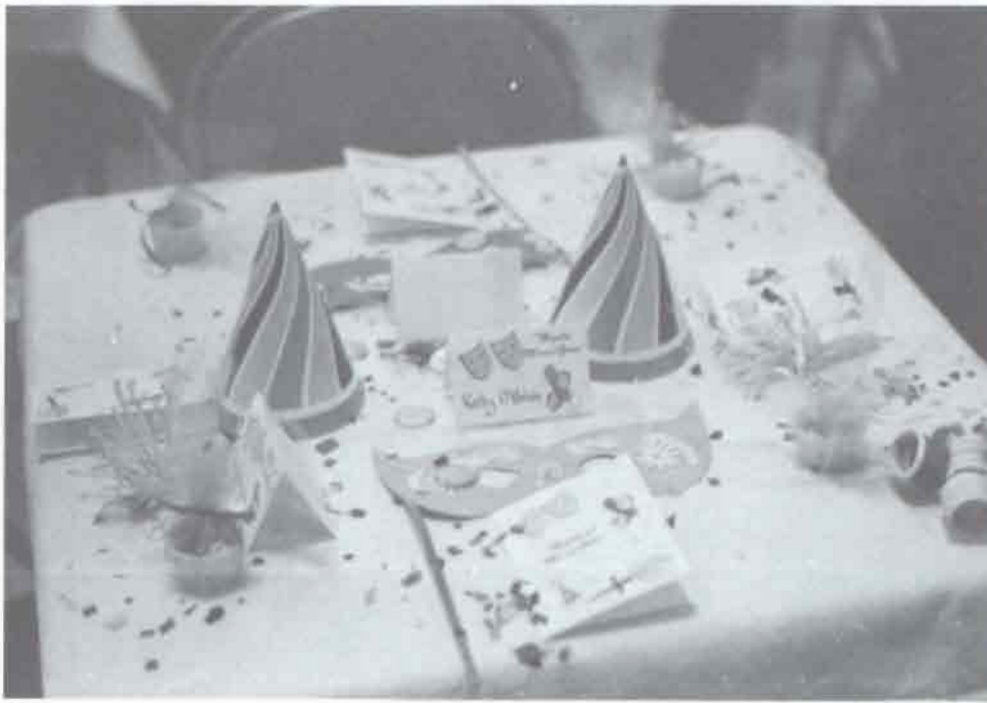


Winter Ball—'68

The Winter Weekend was a big success and it is sure to become a tradition at Dunkirk High school in future years.



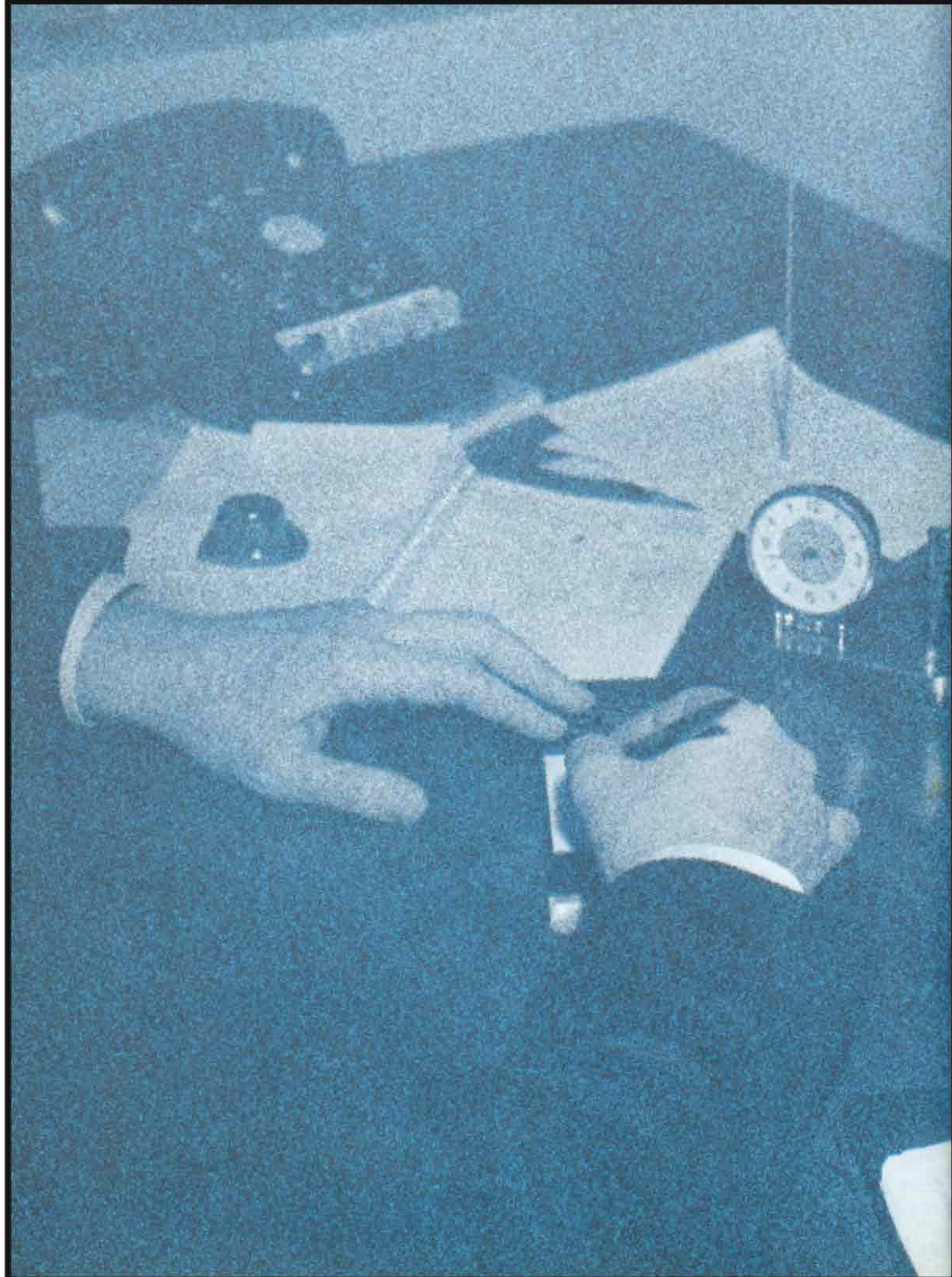

Pupil Personnel Services
