
Our four years at Dunkirk have been filled with many memories, yet it is the individual experiences that make it all worth while . . .

The DHS Cinderwomen had a successful season under second year Coach John Ruska. The young but aggressive team had a 4-3 record.




Coach Bob Wisniewski's Varsity Basketball team finished the 1981 season with a 7-3 league and 10-8 overall tally.
